

How to Run as a PLEO Delegate or At-Large Delegate or Alternate

If you want to run to be one of Florida's Statewide Delegates or Alternates (PLEO or At-Large), here are some tips to help you get started. For more information, please visit the Florida Democratic Party website at www.floridadems.org

- You must be a registered Democrat in the State of Florida.
- It is in your best interest to run as a District Level
 Delegate and get elected by Democrats in your
 Congressional District. Florida will elect 146
 District Level Delegates. You can file to run as a
 District Level Delegate starting February 5 until
 12:00 noon (Eastern Time) March 25. You can find
 the filing forms and detailed information about the
 2024 Democratic National Convention at
 www.floridadems.org.
- Florida will select 29 PLEO Delegates, 49 At-large Delegates, or 19 At-Large Alternates at the statewide level.
- You must file with the Florida Democratic Party to run as a PLEO Delegate candidate, or an At-Large Delegate or Alternate candidate. The delegate filing form will be available from the State Party www.floridadems.org. Candidates must file between February 12 and 12:00 noon (Eastern Time),May 13. Filing is done with the State Party online or by mail at 201 South Monroe Street, Suite 300, Tallahassee, FL 32301.
- To run for a delegate or alternate position, you
 must pledge support to your presidential
 candidate. Therefore, be sure to sign up to help
 your presidential candidate. The campaign will be
 very involved in recruiting individuals for these
 positions and they need to know you support the
 candidate and are working to help get them
 elected.
- Each presidential campaign gets to review the list
 of individuals who want to be one of their
 delegates. They have until <u>5:00 pm, May 20</u> to
 approve names on the list. Check to be sure you're
 on their approved list.
- Persons eligible to be considered for PLEO
 Delegate positions are big city mayors, state-wide

- elected officials, state legislative leaders, state legislators, and other state, county and local elected officials and party leaders.
- Any Florida Democrat can run for an At-Large Delegate or Alternate position. These positions may be primarily used to help ensure Florida's delegation to the National Convention is diverse and representative of the state's Democratic voters.
- The elected District-Level Delegates will meet on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>June 1</u> to select the Party Leader and Elected Official (PLEO) Delegates, and the At-Large Delegates and 19 Alternates. Individuals must file to run for these positions between February 12 and noon (ET) on May 13.
- Following the election of the statewide delegates and alternates, all of Florida's delegates will then meet on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>June 1</u> to select the state's 30 standing committee members (10 members each on the Credentials, Platform and Rules Committees), and a Delegation Chair. Standing committee member positions are allocated to the presidential candidate and the members (who do not need to be delegates) are nominated by the campaign.
- Members of Florida's delegation will join the other delegates from across the nation and around the world to be a part of history at the 49th quadrennial Democratic National Convention <u>August 19-22</u> in Chicago.
